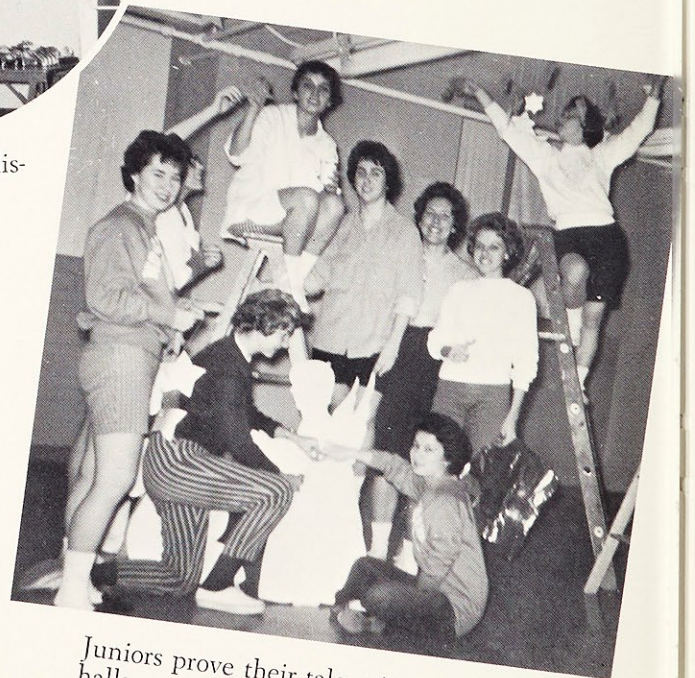

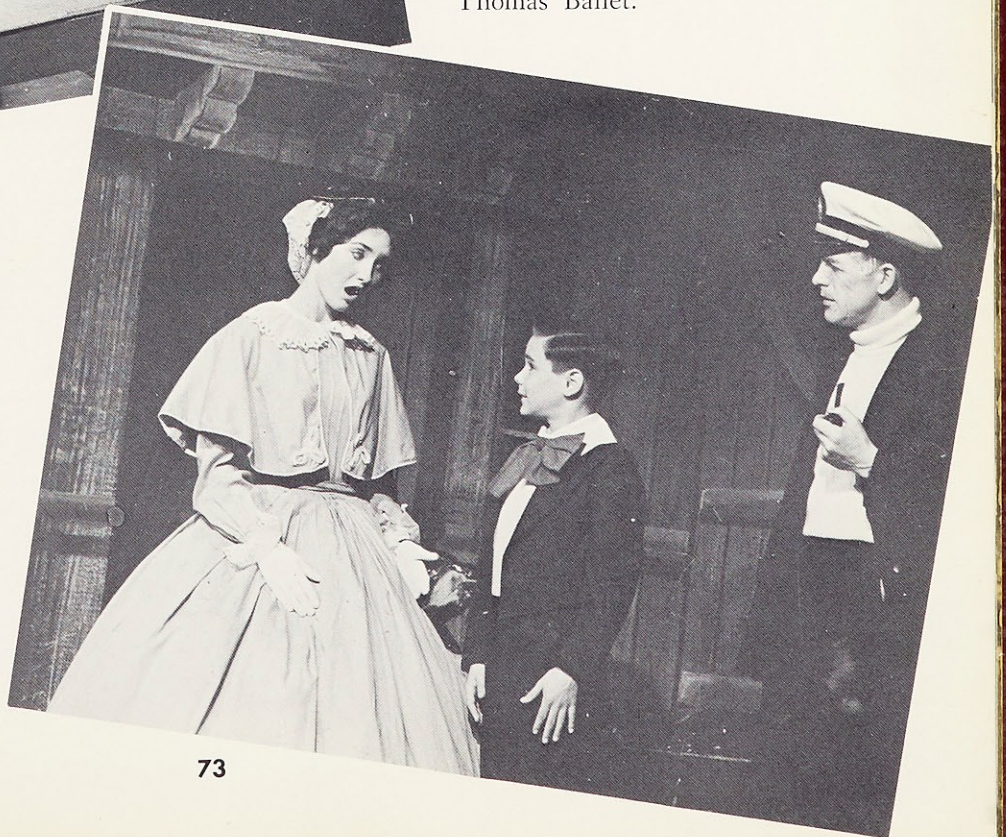

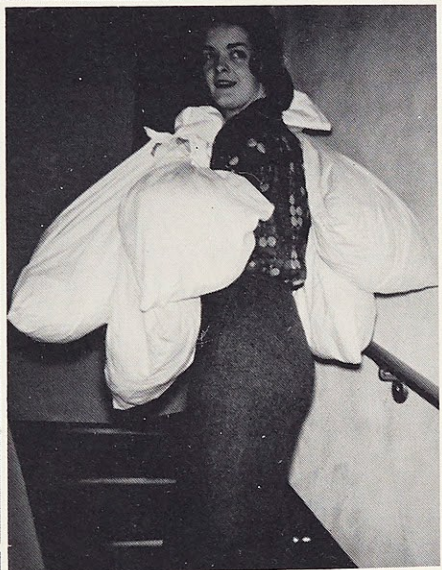


Immediately following these coronation ceremonies, the queen and her court of attendants are entertained by the performance of a Maypole Dance.
